The Arkansas Health Network, LLC Board of Managers has formally approved the following arrangements as reasonably related to the purposes of the Medicare Shared Savings Program (“MSSP”), as required for the MSSP Pre-Participation and Participation Waivers:

1. Clinically Integrated Network Participation Agreements between Arkansas Health Network, LLC and ACO Participants.

Arkansas Health Network, LLC (“AHN”) is currently participating in the Medicare Shared Savings Program (“MSSP”) as an accountable care organization (“ACO”). In connection with its ACO activities, AHN has entered into Clinically Integrated Network Participation Agreements (the “Participation Agreements”) with the ACO Participants identified on this website that include financial incentive programs, and also support services in the form of the ACO Group Practice Reporting Option interface for use by ACO participants for reporting clinical quality measures as consistent with the requirements of the MSSP (“ACO GPRO Interface”).

The Participation Agreements encourage the participating providers to provide clinical services to patients in order to promote improved quality of care under various quality assurance initiatives undertaken by AHN, improve patient satisfaction, and help reduce the cost of providing quality healthcare, all in furtherance of the purposes of the MSSP. The Participation Agreements with the Participants were effective as of the date listed next to their name on this website. The ACO GPRO Interface is intended to provide access to clinical care information as part of AHN’s quality assurance and improvement programs.

The AHN Board of Managers has determined that the foregoing arrangements are reasonably related to the purposes of the MSSP, because they: (i) encourage participating providers to adhere to the quality assurance and improvement program and evidence-based clinical guidelines associated with the AHN and its participation in the MSSP, (ii) promote accountability for the quality, cost, and overall care for AHN’s attributed beneficiaries by assisting with meeting requirements for reporting on quality and cost measures, and (iii) support the MSSP aims of better care for individuals, better health for populations, and lower growth in expenditures.

2. Care Management Training and Services Arrangements Involving Arkansas Health Network, LLC and St. Vincent Infirmiry Medical Center d/b/a St. Vincent Health System.

AHN has entered into a Clinically Integrated Network Participation Agreement with St. Vincent Infirmiry Medical Center d/b/a St. Vincent Health System (“SVHS”)(“Participation Agreement”). In connection with this arrangement and its ACO activities, AHN will provide education and training of SVHS discharge planners, and such SVHS discharge planners will work with AHN in connection with a broader sphere of post-discharge services furnished to Medicare beneficiaries who receive inpatient and outpatient health care services from SVHS.

The AHN Board of Managers has determined that the arrangement involving Care Management Training and Services is reasonably related to the purposes of the MSSP because it: (i) promotes

accountability for the quality, cost, and overall care for Company's attributed beneficiaries by assisting with meeting requirements for reporting on quality and cost measures, and (ii) supports the MSSP aims of better care for individuals, better health for populations, and lower growth in expenditures.

3. Hospital Efficiency Agreement between Arkansas Health Network, LLC and St. Vincent Infirmiry Medical Center d/b/a St. Vincent Health System.

AHN has entered into a Hospital Efficiency Agreement with St. Vincent Infirmiry Medical Center d/b/a St. Vincent Health System ("SVHS") effective January 1, 2015 ("Agreement"), to provide services through AHN's participating providers, that identify and implement best practices and AHN clinical integration activities that are designed to improve the quality and efficiency of the services furnished to SVHS inpatients and outpatients. The arrangement includes financial incentives designed to encourage AHN's participating providers to adhere to certain quality measures to promote improved quality of care and patient safety for hospital inpatients and outpatients, and by doing so, is anticipated to help reduce the cost and improve the efficient of providing health care, all of which supports the purposes of the Medicare Shared Savings Program ("MSSP").

The AHN Board of Managers has determined the Hospital Efficiency Agreement arrangement is reasonably related to the purposes of the MSSP, because it encourages participating providers to adhere to the quality assurance and improvement program and evidence-based clinical guidelines associated with AHN and its participation in the MSSP, and supports the MSSP's aims of better care for individuals, better health for populations, and lower growth in expenditures.
